


#### Attending Remote Court Hearings

Don't forget that while you are not able to visit your children in person, each month you must submit a Monthly Exception Form. You must submit one form for each child you would be regularly visiting. Do not submit one form for a group of children. Also, please note that these forms are to be used in the future ANY time you can not visit with your child(ren) during the month not just in response to the Coronavirus issues we are facing. 

#### **Foster Care Facts**

The purpose of the Foster Care <u>FACTS</u> is to summarize key data points for our knowledge and management; have consistent data released to the field or external partners who request data on specific points; and produce data for comparisons over time and between regions.

The creation of Foster Care FACTS is intended to create consistency in how DCBS reports to others. These are the numbers to release when asked questions like, how many children are in OOHC (Out of Home Care)? Here we would always release the same total number of children in OOHC with active placements. The data can be verified using standard TWIST reports.
